Full Terms and conditions:

- Applications will open on 11 September 2026 and close on 13 November 2026.
- Applicants must complete the full application form and provide full information required and supporting documentation.
- The nominated charity must be a registered charity with up-to-date status on the Public Register of Charities listing.
- This initiative is open to employees of a broker who may apply on behalf of a charity they support or that their broker supports, provided the broker has donated to that charity within the eligibility timeframe.
- Brokers and their employees may submit multiple applications.
- The broker must have donated to the nominated charity between 01 January 2026 and 13 November 2026. Proof of payment must be uploaded as part of application.
- Applications must align with the Intact Insurance purpose; We are here to help people, businesses and society prosper in good times and be resilient in bad times.
- The charity must support inclusive services or programmes that provide a benefit to the local community.
- Applications will be reviewed in late November 2026.
- The review panel will comprise representatives from Personal Lines, Commercial Lines, Marketing, Sustainability and Compliance at Intact Insurance Ireland DAC.
- Successful applicants will be notified between late November and early December 2026.
- Funding will be paid directly to the nominated charitable organisation.
- The maximum funding available under this programme is capped at €5,000 per successful application.
- The matched donation to the charity will not exceed the donation amount made by the broker to the charity.
